The Harnett County Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) announces the anticipated availability of \$224,037 in intervention and prevention funds to for services to youth most at risk of court involvement. The Harnett County JCPC having studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the Department of Public Safety, Division of Adult Correction and Juvenile Justice (DPS ACJJ) in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the **state fiscal year 2017-2018** beginning on, or after, **July 1, 2017**. The use of DPS funds in this county **requires a local match** in the amount specified above.

Based on identified needed programs and possible gaps in the services continuum, the following program types will be considered for funding:

Parenting/Family Skill Building	Mentoring	
Interpersonal Skill Building	Teen Court	Temporary Shelter Care
Restitution/Community Services	Sex Offender Specific Evaluations	Mediation

As result of the Needs Assessment in the above named County, programs that reduce risk, address the needs of juvenile and increase protective factors will be considered for funding. Proposed Program Services should target the following Risk Factors for Delinquency or Repeat Delinquency:

- Adjudicated youth are 12 years or older when first delinquent offense is alleged in a complaint
- Youth report some substance/mental health issues and/or need further assessing or treatment
- Adjudicated youth have moderate to serious behavior problems at school
- Adjudicated youth associates with negative/delinquent peers
- Lack of parental supervision

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for Adjudicated Youth:

Peer Domain: Youth association with negative and/or delinquent peers.

Individual Domain: Youth are age 12 years or older at the time of the 1st delinquent offense alleged in a complaint. Youth reported having mental health issues that are being addressed and/or need further assessing or treatment.

Family Domain: Parent/Guardian custodian supervision skills are reported as marginal; domestic discord in the home; and family members with a criminal history.

School Domain: Youth have moderate to serious school behavior problems as a result poor school attendance, excessive in-school and or out of school suspensions.

Applicants are being sought that are able to address the legislatively mandated items below:

1. Program services compatible with research that is shown to be effective with juvenile offenders
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals.

Only local public agencies, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities will be considered for funding.

Private non-profits are also required to upload the following forms online in NCALLIES or your application is considered incomplete: 1) No Over Due Tax form (available at the above link), 2) Notarized DPS Conflict of Interest Statement (available at the above link), 3) the agencies Conflict of Interest Policy; and 4) Proof of 501(c)(3) status.

All applications must be submitted in NCALLIES by the deadline below to be considered for funding.
