Women Infants and Children (WIC):

WIC is a federally-funded health and nutrition program for women, infants, and children. The goal is to reduce and prevent nutrition related health problems.

Participants must meet income guidelines and either be pregnant women, new mothers, infants or children under age five. Women's Health:

Women's Preventive Health provides a variety of women's health services, including family planning, which is available for all women of childbearing age (including teens). Services provided include Pap tests, breast exams, testing for sexually transmitted diseases, education and birth control methods, pregnancy testing and more.

Our mission is to prevent illness, diseases, and injuries, promote healthy lifestyles, and keep the environment clean, healthy and safe.

Adult Health: The Adult Health Division offers a variety of services for adults ranging from blood pressure checks to examinations. These services are provided for men and women. The following are screening services provided: Cholesterol, Blood sugar, Blood pressure, HIV counseling and testing, and Adult Immunizations. If you have questions regarding the Adult Health programs or would like to make an appointment, please call our appointment desk at 910-893-7550.

Child Health: The Child Health Division provides healthcare for children. Services include well child checkups and complete physicals for kindergarten, daycare and head start programs. A Physician Extender is available to provide care for sick children and provide routine physical examinations. Appointments are required for all clinical checks and or exams. Immunizations help protect children from illnesses.

Communicable Disease: In order to identify and contain outbreaks of communicable diseases the Health Department, in compliance with state and federal regulations, maintains surveillance, investigates, and reports certain communicable diseases. Control and prevention measures are implemented as needed. Staff conducts an

investigation in an effort to slow the transmission of the disease, provide education and make sure patients and contacts are treated appropriately. Staff assists with tracking trends and assists in the investigation of disease outbreaks within the community.

Preventing the spread of disease

Environmental Health: This Division has the following primary functions: Provide inspections and active enforcement of county and state rules and regulations. Issue on-site wastewater treatment (septic) system permits. Issue well permits. Conduct sanitation inspections and oversees sanitation rules for restaurants, school lunchrooms, meat markets, other food-handling establishments; public swimming pools, child care centers, school buildings, tattoo establishments, lodging establishments, bed & breakfast homes, bed & breakfast inns, hospitals, nursing and rest homes, summer camps, local confinement facilities, and residential care facilities. Monitors and enforces drinking water quality.

Protect the environment; this can make our community a healthier place to live.

Health Education: Educating the public about health issues is a goal of public health. Programs are implemented to promote wellness and healthy lifestyles. Health Educators work to mobilize community partnerships and to identify and solve community health problems.

Home Health: The Home Health Division provides Health care within the home, which enables you to enjoy the privacy and independence of home without sacrificing your medical needs. Health Care professionals travel to your home or assisted living facility to provide a range of services that can include skilled nursing care, rehabilitation therapies, in-home assistance, Occupational therapy, Medical nutrition therapy and In-home aide services. Any Harnett County resident in need of skilled medical service is eligible to receive home health care with a physician's order. Your physician will contact the Harnett County Home Health Agency, where a staff member will prepare a treatment plan under the guidance of your physician. For more information 910-893-7544.

Caring for you in the comfort of your home

Social Work/Family Care Coordination: This division offers two formal case management programs designed to support children, expectant parents and families. Child Service Coordination and Maternity Care Coordination, the Child Services Coordination program assists families who have child development concerns about their child. All children birth to five years of age with special needs are eligible. This voluntary program helps families locate and use community services that are designed to support families. There is no charge for your family to participate. If you have children from birth to age five who qualify for the program, your child service coordinator will work with you in meeting your family's needs.

Maternity Care Coordination is a case management program, for all pregnant women who are both Medicaid and non-Medicaid eligible.
