



Schools require children to be up to date on vaccinations before enrolling or starting school in order to protect the health of all students.

The Tdap vaccine is a booster recommended from ages 10-12 to protect against three serious diseases: tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis or whooping cough.

**New Rule for School Effective July 1, 2015**

- Students entering 6<sup>th</sup> grade in the fall of 2014 are **required** to have a Tdap booster
- Effective July 1, 2015, all students entering 7<sup>th</sup> grade will be **required** to receive a meningococcal vaccine in addition to the Tdap.

Therefore, it is recommended that all students entering 6<sup>th</sup> grade in the fall of 2014 receive **both Tdap and Meningococcal vaccines**.

- Vaccines will not be given unless the parent/legal guardian is present
  - Please bring your child's most up to date Immunization record
  - Medicaid, NC Health Choice, BCBS, and Medcost insurances accepted.
  - Patients with other insurances will be required to pay at time of service. Cash, personal check, Visa, Mastercard, and Discover accepted.
  - Uninsured children may receive vaccines at no charge.
