



Cape Fear River Trail Park



Rules and Regulations

- Park Hours of Operation shall be every day from dawn until dusk.
- Parking is allowed only in designated areas and only during park's operating hours. The County/Town reserves the right to tow vehicles in violation of this policy.
- No loitering is permitted.
- Canoes and kayaks may only be launched, tied up, or left in designated areas.
- Canoes and kayaks left unattended are the sole responsibility of the owner. Canoes and kayaks may not be left with the park overnight.
- Watercraft of any type, other than canoes and kayaks, may not be launched from within the park.
- Pets are allowed within the park areas and must be on a leash. Pet owners are required to dispose of any waste left by the animal in waste containers.
- Hunting, feeding, or otherwise harassing wildlife within the park area is prohibited.
- Plants and animals should not be added to or removed from the park area.
- Fishing is permitted to licensed fishermen in all areas of the park, except within 100 feet in all directions of the canoe and kayak launch area. Fish cleaning is prohibited in the park.
- Alcoholic beverages are prohibited within the park.
- Littering or dumping of waste within the park is prohibited. All waste shall be disposed of in waste containers.
- Glass containers are prohibited in the park.
- Children under the age of 12 should be under the supervision of an adult while on park premises.
- Fireworks (including sparklers) are prohibited within the park.
- The picnic shelter is available on a first come-first serve basis.
- Grills (GAS ONLY) will be allowed in the designated grilling area only.
- Camping is prohibited in the park area.
- Patrons should stay on designated trails. Climbing on trees and structures are prohibited.
- Shoes are required. No bare feet allowed.
- Trails are for walking and jogging only.
- Bicycles, horses, and motorized vehicles are prohibited except for the launching or removal of canoes and kayaks.
- Visitors are encouraged to carry a cell phone while in the park area.
