
OPERATION GREEN LIGHT

N.C. SCHOOL BUS STOP LAW


All drivers must not only be aware around school buses, but also know the law of the road.

Instead, if you would like to receive weather Watch and Warning alerts via email and/or text message, we encourage you to sign up for our RAVE Public Notification System!

In the event potential disaster weather is forecasted (such as a hurricane), we will continue to push National Weather Service emails containing area forecasts starting three days out from the anticipated event.

North Carolina honors 66 drinking water treatment plants with AWOP awards.

The N.C. Division of Water Resources has honored 66 water treatment plants, including Harnett Regional Water, for surpassing federal and state drinking water standards in 2021. The division's Public Water Supply Section awarded the facilities the prestigious N.C. Area Wide Optimization Award, which is part of a state effort to enhance the performance of existing surface water treatment facilities.

For 2021, the state recognized 16 facilities with the "Gold Star" honor, which is an award for systems that have received the N.C. Area Wide Optimization Award for 10 or more consecutive years.

STAY HEALTHY: GET YOUR FLU SHOT!

The best way to reduce your risk from seasonal flu and its potentially serious complications is to get vaccinated every year. Get your flu shot without leaving your car! The Health Department is providing "drive up" flu shots, Monday-Friday: 8:00-11:00am and 1:00-4:00pm at 307 W. Cornelius Harnett Blvd in Lillington. Influenza (flu) is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses. It can cause mild to severe illness. Everyone 6 months and older should get a flu vaccine every season. Make plans to get vaccinated early in fall, before flu season begins. September and October are good times to get a flu vaccine.

The Health Department is providing free at-home COVID-19 test kits. Persons can pick up at-home COVID-19 test kits Monday-Friday between the hours of 8:00am-11:00am or 1:00pm-4:00pm at the Health Department which is located within the Governmental Complex at 307 W. VACCINE & BOOSTER SHOTS




CDC recommends COVID-19 vaccines for everyone <u>6 months and older</u>. The benefit of COVID-19 vaccines, like other vaccines, is that those vaccinated get protection without risking the potentially serious consequences of getting sick with COVID-19. Needing your booster shot? Staying up to date with your COVID-19 vaccines will provide you with the best protection against the COVID-19 virus. Anyone ages 5 and older should receive a single COVID-19 booster. Certain individuals may receive two COVID-19 boosters. NCDHHS encourages individuals to speak with a doctor, nurse or pharmacist if they have questions about what booster is right for them. Timing of your first booster is dependent on your primary series and your medical history. 
