## FISCAL YEAR 2023 COUNTY BUDGET

Harnett County Board of Commissioners adopted the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 County Budget at the June 20 regular meeting. The County's Annual Budget estimates the total value of resources required to perform County operations and support citizen needs. It also sets tax rates and fee schedule for the Fiscal Year.

For this Fiscal Year, Commissioners set a tax rate of 0.591 cents per \$100 property valuation. This means the approved tax rate is a 16 cent reduction per \$100 property valuation from last year's tax rate. Commissioners also provided funding to continue to support Harnett County Schools, public safety, and County departments to meet the growing needs of our citizens.

The County's adopted budget will now serve as the spending plan for this Fiscal Year, which runs July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023.



Instead, if you would like to receive weather Watch and Warning alerts via email and/or text message, we encourage you to sign up for our RAVE Public Notification System!

In the event potential disaster weather is forecasted (such as a hurricane), we will continue to push National Weather Service emails containing area forecasts starting three days out from the anticipated event.




#### Applications for 2022 Master Gardener Initial Training Class



### REX MOBILE MAMMOGRAPHY

Put yourself first and schedule a mammogram! Breast cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death in women, but it is also one of the most treatable when detected early! The best way to detect breast cancer early is through an annual mammogram. The Harnett County Health Department provides access to this important screening tool through Rex Mobile Mammography. ### FREE AT-HOME TEST KITS



Every home in the U.S. is eligible to order a third round of free at-home COVID-19 tests. The tests are completely free. The tests will be rapid antigen at-home tests, and you will receive results within 30 minutes (no lab drop-off required). Order your tests at <u>www.covidtests.gov</u>.

### **VACCINE & BOOSTER SHOTS**



The Health Department is providing the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine for ages 5 and older. The COVID-19 vaccines are free of charge to all individuals, regardless of immigration or health insurance status. If you would like to make an appointment, complete the <u>COVID-19 Vaccine Inquiry Form</u> or call the Health Department at 910-814-6582. All vaccinations will be administered by appointment. The Health Department is located within the Governmental Complex at 307 W. Cornelius Harnett Blvd in Lillington.

CDC recommends COVID-19 vaccines for everyone 6 months and older. The benefit of COVID-19 vaccines, like other vaccines, is that those vaccinated get protection without risking the potentially serious consequences of getting sick with COVID-19. **Needing your booster shot?** COVID-19 vaccine boosters can further enhance or restore protection that might have decreased over time after your primary series vaccination. Staying up to date with your COVID-19 vaccines will provide you with the best protection against the COVID-19 virus. Anyone ages 5 and older should receive a single COVID-19 booster. Certain individuals may receive two COVID-19 boosters. Adults may receive any brand of the COVID-19 vaccine for their booster, while children 5 to 17 can only receive Pfizer. NCDHHS encourages individuals to speak with a doctor, nurse or pharmacist if they have questions about what booster is right for them. Timing of your first booster is dependent on your primary series and your medical history. Please call to inquire about scheduling your booster dose at the correct interval.
